

Q1. What is the Application fee for International Students?

Answer- The Application Fee for international students is 100 CAD.

Q2. Is this application fee refundable?

Answer- No, the application fee is non-refundable.

Q3. What is the application process?

Answer- You can find the complete application process at our website - [International Student - Apply Now | Oulton College](#)

Q4. What will be the next step after submitting the application to Oulton College?

Answer- You will be contacted by one of the admissions advisors to schedule a virtual meeting with you, and if your application fee is not received then you will be asked to do the same prior to booking a meeting. After reviewing your application and discussing the program details, the admission advisors will confirm your eligibility for the program and send you a letter of Admission. Once accepted, you will receive information to prepare for your program.

Q5. Once I have been accepted what will be my next step?

Answer- The next step is to pay the deposit amount as mentioned in your letter of Admission and provide for the pending requirements if any.

Q6. What is the next step after paying the Deposit?

Answer- If you are a student who requires a Provincial Attestation Letter, you will need to attempt the OPAL Assessment (Oulton Provincial Attestation Letter Assessment) and send us the documentation that you will use to submit your study permit application including the proof of funds, Income proofs, Letter of Explanation, Updated Resume, Passport Copy etc. After successful completion of your OPAL Assessment Oulton college will provide you with your Letter of Acceptance, Contract and the Provincial Attestation Letter.

And if you do not need a Provincial Attestation Letter, you will be provided with the LOA(Letter of Acceptance) and the contract after the deposit is received.

Q7. What if I do not meet the requirements of the OPAL Assessment?

Answer- All the refundable amount paid by you will be refunded in this case.

Q8. How long does it take to get a reply after I have submitted my application Online?

Answer- Applicants are contacted by the Admissions advisors within 7 days from the date of application.

Q9. How long does it take for Oulton College to process the PAL (Provincial Attestation Letter)?

Answer- After the successful completion of the OPAL Assessment (Oulton Provincial Attestation Letter Assessment), the applicant can expect to get all his documents including the PAL (Provincial Attestation Letter) within a week.

Q10. I am already in Canada, can I come to Oulton college to apply Offline?

Answer- Yes, we accept direct walk-ins as well, but we highly recommend the applicants to book an appointment prior to their visit.

Q11. How long is the PAL (Provincial Attestation Letter) valid for ?

Answer- PAL (Provincial Attestation Letter) is valid for 60 days from the date of issuance.

Q12. How early should I start my application process with Oulton College?

Answer- We encourage all our International Applicants to start their application process 6 months prior to the program start date, as the IRCC's processing time may vary from country to country and can take months. Applying on time also helps the applicants to make all other arrangements prior to moving to Canada.

Q13. How many Intakes are offered in Oulton College?

Answer- Oulton College offers admissions in two intakes-

1. Winter
2. Fall

Q14. What is the deadline to apply for the Winter and Fall Intakes?

Ans – Oulton College does not impose specific deadlines for applications; however, prospective students are advised to apply with consideration of the processing times required for study permits.

Q15. Are there any scholarships, rewards, bursaries or grants for the International Student?

Answer- Currently there are no scholarship programs available for the International Students.

Q16. What is the level of programs offered at Oulton College?

Answer – All of our programs are offered at the Undergraduate level, whether it is a Diploma or a Degree.

Q18. Are the International students eligible to work Part time while studying with Oulton College?

Answer- Most of our International students have the rights to work for Certain hours per week during their studies as per the IRCC policies, but the policies can be different for different applicants, and it is generally same for all the applicants unless there are any special restrictions on the study permit.

Q19. Will I get a PGWP (Post Graduation work Permit) after graduating from Oulton College?

Answer- No, the students are not directly eligible for a work permit after graduation from Oulton College, but as per the New Brunswick Private Career College Graduate Pilot Program all the graduates of the eligible programs get 90 days to accept a Job and as soon as a Job offer is accepted it makes them eligible for a Work permit and the Permanent residency as well. So, in fact it is a better option than to have a PGWP only.

Q20. Will I get any support from the Oulton College to find a Job after my graduation?

Answer- The Career services team at Oulton College is solely dedicated to assist the students in finding Jobs, the process of honing the skills of the students starts from the very first day at Oulton College and throughout their journey with Oulton College there are imparted with all the Professional skills they that need to land a job and have a successful career. On the job training, Practicums, Guest lectures and laboratories make them super-efficient in their skills and help them make a great industry network.

Q25. What are English Language Proficiency test requirements at Oulton College?

Answer- The ELP English Language Proficiency test requirements at Oulton College are as follows-

- [CAEL](#) – minimum score of 60
- [IELTS](#) – 6.0, with no individual score lower than 5.5
- [TOEFL \(IBT\)](#) – 80, with no individual score lower than 18
- [MELAB](#) – minimum score of 80
- [Duolingo](#) – minimum score of 105 with no subject test score less than 95
- [Cambridge English](#) – minimum score of 169
- [Pearson Test](#) of English – minimum score of 50

Answer- As per the IRCC, International Students need to have at least CAD 20,635 in their bank accounts as the Living Expenses other than their Tuition Fees.

Answer- Oulton College does not help with submitting study permit applications, but we periodically host free webinars with Registered Canadian Immigration Consultants. Q30. Will I get any benefit if I refer my friends or relatives to Oulton College?

Answer- We offer a referral reward of 500 CAD for any International Student referred to Oulton College, and 100 CAD for a referred domestic student.

Q31. What are the admissions requirements for the International Students?

Answer - The admission criteria for the faculties of Business, IT, and Human Services include acceptance of a Grade 12 Diploma, Adult Diploma, or GED with a Pass grade. For programs in the health sciences, applicants must satisfy different requirements: completion of Grades 11 or 12 English at either academic or regular level, and attainment of a minimum average of 65% in either Grade 11 or 12 Chemistry or Biology, which must also be academic or regular level.

Q32. What programs are available for international students at Oulton College?

Answer- International students at Oulton College can enroll in a variety of programs across business, healthcare, hospitality, education, technology, and veterinary fields. Programs excluded for international students are Paralegal/Legal Assistant, Policing & Corrections Foundation and Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
